Clear Hills County Council recently made the difficult decision to write off a substantial amount of uncollectable oil and gas property taxes. Council and Administration understand that this may be very alarming for County residents however we want to assure you that this decision was not made lightly. Every effort was made to try to collect the outstanding balances including obtaining legal opinions to determine if there were any legal options for collecting i.e., filing Statements of Claim with the court, asset seizure etc. Unfortunately for the majority of the properties the companies no longer exist and have been struck from the Alberta Corporate Registry.

Uncollectable oil and gas property taxes is not just an issue in Clear Hills County. The Rural Municipalities of Alberta (RMA) estimates that a number of oil and gas firms owe approximately \$245 million in unpaid taxes to approximately 69 municipalities, mostly in rural Alberta.

Until now municipalities had little recourse to recover this revenue, especially when other, secured creditors had priority for collecting unpaid debts. It is for this reason that Council had previously chosen not to write off the outstanding uncollectable balances. They wanted to be able to use these amounts to leverage the Provincial government for change.

Clear Hills County along with RMA and many other Alberta municipalities have successfully lobbied the government for the following:

- The restoration of a special lien that gives municipalities priority over other creditors from oil and gas companies.
- A Ministerial Order directing the AER to require, as a precondition to obtaining a new well licence or transfer of an existing well licence, confirmation that the transferor or the transferee either has no outstanding municipal taxes exceeding a certain threshold, or has entered into a payment plan for such taxes.
- The Provincial Education Requisition Credit (PERC) program which allows Municipalities to apply for education property tax credits equal to the uncollectable education property taxes on delinquent oil and gas properties. To date the County has received over \$486,000 in PERC credits.
- The Designated Industrial Requisition Credit (DIRC) program which allows Municipalities to apply for designated industrial property tax credits equal to the uncollectable designated industrial property taxes on delinquent oil and gas properties. To date the County has received over \$19,000 in DIRC credits.

Although there are a few delinquent oil and gas companies in the County it's important to note that the majority of the oil and gas companies operating in the County pay their municipal property taxes and are good corporate citizens.



Clear Hills County transfer stations are no longer accepting used chemical jugs.

Fairview North Peace Regional Landfill (NPRL) will be accepting used chemical UNTIL December 31, 2023.

As of January 1, 2024 all used chemicals jugs will have to be returned to participating retailers.

Across Canada, farmers return used ag items like jugs to ag-retailers. This streamlines the process and brings it into alignment with other provinces. It simplifies the program since your ag retailer may already be accepting Cleanfarms materials and it makes it easier for your municipality since they won't need to look after extra items. Most of all, when you're thinking about which materials you want to bundle up to recycle, you know they're all going to the same place: your local ag retailer.

How does this work for growers?

1. Rinse & remove

- Use chemical handler/ triple rinse/ pressure rinse
- Remove paper booklets, and discard

2. Fill bag & close

- Place rinsed containers in bag and securely close
- Only one material type per bag (i.e., jugs)

3. Seed treatment containers

- Caps are to remain securely ON

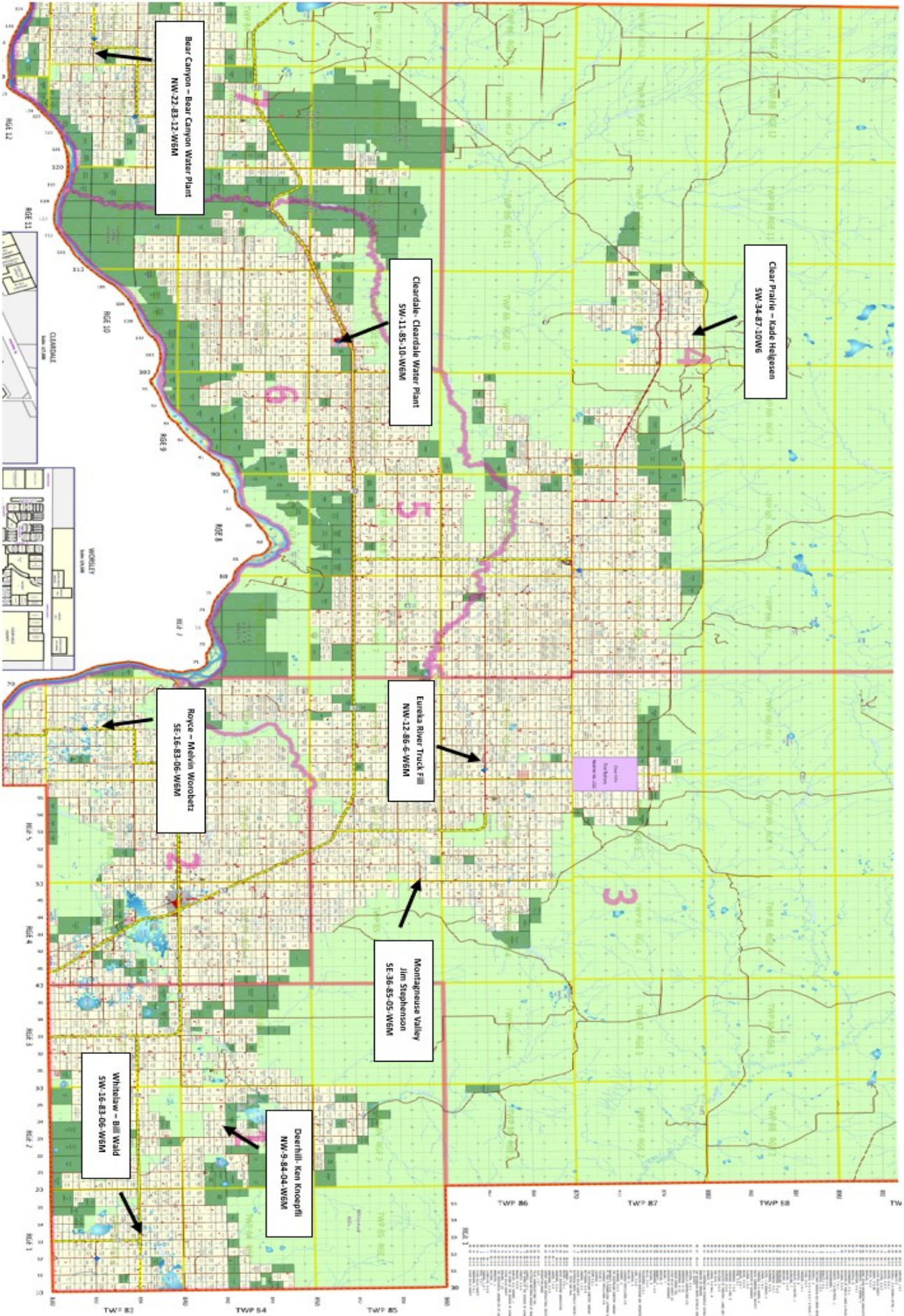
- Place in a separate collection bag (note - this is preferred for collection at municipal sites and required at retail sites and it make it easier for storage and transportation)

4. Return for recycling. Check with your retailer to see when you can begin returning to retail

For 2022: Please ask your local retailer if they have begun accepting jugs as many are participating in the program before municipal sites are phasing out. 2023 is the year where Manitoba and Alberta farmers will see the most change and we'll announce it with ads in local newspapers, on radio, social media and with posters at your ag retailer. Also, municipal sites that are no longer receiving materials will post signs long before they close.

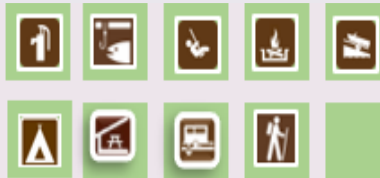

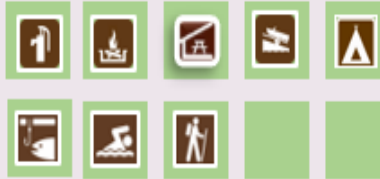

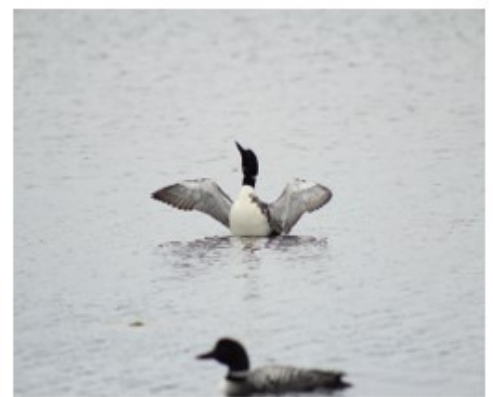

Do you need a Development Permit?

Development Permits are required in Clear Hills County pursuant to the Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw. A Development Permit ensures that the proposed use of the land does not conflict with surrounding uses and that the proposed development is set back the appropriate distances from the property lines and roadways, located in a safe location (not too close to water bodies or oil and gas facilities etc.)

When you are planning to construct a new building, structurally renovate an existing building, or change the use of your property, you will need a development permit.

The Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw also details development NOT requiring a permit. A few common ones are:

- Any farm use building, shed, dugout (located at least 40.8m/134 feet from the road right-of-way) or minor accessory use that otherwise conforms with the provisions of the Land Use Bylaw.
- Minor repair or maintenance to a building (provided there are no structural changes).
- The erection or repair of a fence that is less than 1 meter (3 feet) in height in front yards and 2 meters (6 feet) in height in rear and side yards.
- Decks (provided they have no walls or roof and are less than .6 meter (2 feet) from the ground level.
- Accessory buildings (sheds etc.) under 9.29m² that do not have a foundation.

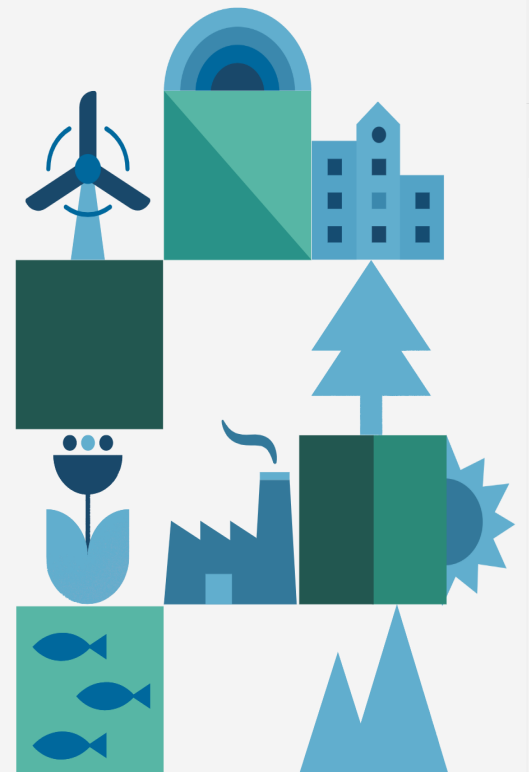
In accordance with the Municipal Government Act every municipality must pass a land use bylaw.

The purpose of the bylaw is to outline the rules and regulations for development of land within the Municipality.

Clear Hills County Council is reviewing our current Land Use Bylaw to make it easier to read and find information, in addition also cleaning up duplicate items or items that are not relevant to our county. This review is being completed without changing the original content and information.

If you are planning to construct a building, start a business, change land use (zone), undertake renovations or redevelopment, erect a sign, or establish a secondary suite, the Land Use Bylaw will provide direction on the applicable rules and regulations you'll need to consider.

* DTaP-IPV-Hib-HB – for children born on or after March 1, 2018. Children born before March 1, 2018, are offered DTaP-IPV-Hib at ages 2, 4 and 6 months and Hepatitis B vaccine in school.

† A 3rd dose of HPV is needed only for students starting the vaccine series at 15 years of age or older and anyone with a weak immune system.

Note: More vaccines may be needed because of health conditions, work, school, living arrangements, household contacts, lifestyle risks, travel, or because a person was not fully immunized in childhood. Check with your healthcare provider, a public health nurse, your workplace health and safety department, or a travel health clinic to find out if you need any other vaccines and if they are free for you.

Do you have livestock?

Are you aware of the VSI (Veterinarian Services Incorporated) Program?

- * Aids in the development of livestock expansion with a long term goal of the producer and veterinarian services sustainability.
- * The VSI program supplies a cost-share support to livestock producers, whereby Clear Hills County covers 50% of the cost eligible veterinary procedures.
- * Membership is \$52.50 for a five year term.

Do you know the County has a BSE Testing Incentive Program?

The BSE testing program is to encourage producers to participate in BST Testing and assist in realizing the target of 30,000 beef cattle annually being tested to keep Canada's status as a controlled BSE risk country.

Eligibility: must be a VSI member and resident/landowner in Clear Hills County with livestock.

Restrictions: Only Veterinarian Clinics (and livestock owners) will have access to the BSE test results.

Process: VSI services provides the County with a list of members that had beef cattle tested in the quarterly report. The County then pays the member. The 2022/2023 incentive is \$125/animal.

Alberta is extremely susceptible to invasive species. Some species are looking to get a good hold on our waterways and others are looking to invade our productive agricultural land. For this reason, the *Weed Control Act*, proclaimed in 1907 has existed in some form for more than 100 years, making it Alberta's oldest piece of legislation. Its latest version (proclaimed in June 2010) listed 46 Prohibited Noxious and 29 Noxious weeds requiring either eradication in the case of Prohibited Noxious or control in the case of Noxious. The revisions showed an increased focus on new plants, that most had assumed weren't even in Alberta yet.

To assist landowners/occupants to identify and develop control of these legislated weeds, Clear Hills County appoints Weed Inspectors annually. One of their goals is to create awareness about these new invasive weeds and why they must be controlled or eradicated.

Weed Report vs. Weed Notice

Should a Weed Inspector discover a noxious weed, they will write up a Weed Report and inform the landowner of the weed infestation. This is not a Weed Notice. A Weed Report is offered as an informational tool to encourage landowners to control the weeds in question or to contact the Agricultural Services Department to learn more about plant management.

A Weed Notice, on the other hand, is a legal document under the Alberta Weed Control Act. A Notice will be issued if a landowner has repeatedly failed to control the weeds identified in the Weed Report. A Weed Notice is a document that, if not complied with, will lead Clear Hills County taking control/eradicating the weeds in question with the landowner still responsible for the costs of the control.



Under the Act, Weed Inspectors, “may enter at any reasonable hour on land premises, and inspect the land or any crops, hay, etc., on the premises.”

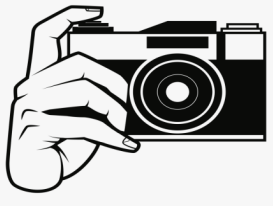

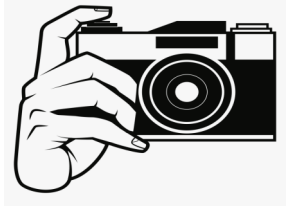

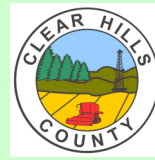
