WHEREAS Pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000, Chapter M-26, Council may amend a Land Use Bylaw, and; WHEREAS Pursuant to Sections 230, 606 and 692 of the Province of Alberta Municipal Government Act, a Council may amend a Land Use Bylaw, and The Municipal Council of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta, has WHEREAS adopted Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw No. 189-16, as amended, and; WHEREAS The Municipal Council of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta, deems it necessary to amend Clear Hills County Land Use Bylaw No. 189-16, as amended, to allow the keeping of poultry in hamlet residential districts. **NOW** THEREFORE The Municipal Council of Clear Hills County, in the Province of Alberta, in Council duly assembled, enacts as follows; Replace Section 8.21 under General Land Use Provisions with the following: 1) 8.21 Keeping of Animals No livestock or fur-bearing animals, other than domestic pets, shall be raised or kept in any hamlet residential district. The keeping of poultry shall be allowed in any hamlet residential district as a discretionary use, and shall adhere to the County's Poultry Bylaw. Structures related to the keeping of poultry shall require a development permit prior to their erection. If any portion of this bylaw is declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the 2) invalid portion shall be severed. That this bylaw shall take force and effect on the date of its final passage. 3) First Reading given on the 8 day of September, 2020. Second Reading given on the 13 day of October, 2020. BACKGROUND

The MMSA Office was contacted by the Chief Administrative Officer on June 20, 2023 to discuss an application for an amendment to the Land Use Bylaw from the Peace River School Division to keep livestock on their Worsley school site for educational purposes. In response, MMSA recommended investigating the issue further and presenting a planning report to Council, outlining what factors and options the County may take into account in dealing with the issue. The following planning report highlights the relevant information and options the County might consider in amending the Land Use Bylaw to facilitate the use.

PROPOSAL AND SITE CONTEXT

The Worsley Central School is one of five educational facilities operated by the Peace River School Division No. 10 within the County, the others being Menno Simons Community School in Cleardale, Hines Creek Colony School near Hines Creek, Bear Canyon Colony School in Bear Canyon, and Cleardale Colony School near Cleardale.

The school occupies approximately 14.69 acres of land, located at the intersection of North Street and Alberta Avenue, about 2.5 km from the County Office, within the hamlet of Worsley, in the south-central part of the County (figure 1). The legal land description is SW-6-87-7-W6. The existing developments onsite include a school building, library, store, detached garages and a fenced tennis court. Adjacent to the school is the Worsley Agricultural Society Building to the north; an agricultural parcel containing a manufactured home to the east; a vacant farmland to the south; two Telus-owned properties, one of which houses a mobile communications structure, to the west; and a small residential parcel containing a manufactured home to the northwest.

The proposal, according to the Chief Administrative Officer, is to keep a number of goats onsite, the intent being for educational or instructional purposes. As of the time of preparing this report, it is not clear how many and what species of goats the school plans to keep onsite. This, in addition to other information, such as the number and type of structures proposed for the keeping of the animals and whether or not there will be an onsite caretaker, have been requested for but are yet to be provided.

POLICY AND REGULATORY CONTEXT

It is important to evaluate new planning and land use proposals within the context of the County's planning framework. This is to ensure that such proposals are supported by the relevant policies, directions and regulations designed to guide the use of lands and buildings within the municipality. Where there are any inconsistencies between a proposed development or use of land and the planning framework, then an amendment to the relevant document(s) or policies may be necessary in order to facilitate the development, if supported by the Municipality, or the proposal would have to be declined or modified.

The County's planning framework comprise of its statutory plans (including the Municipal Development Plan and Intermunicipal Development Plan), the Land Use Bylaw and as well as other standalone policies, studies and reports adopted or approved by Council pertaining to planning and development.

Adopted by Council in 2019, the Municipal Development Plan (MDP) is the County's primary long-range, municipal planning document, which sets the policy direction and designates the appropriate future uses of all lands within the County. The MDP promotes the provision of quality educational facilities in the County for residents, as evidenced by the following policy statements and objectives:

- To facilitate growth of commercial, industrial, and institutional areas while minimizing the impact on residential areas (P. 4);
- The County will advocate to Alberta Education in improving the level of educational facilities and access to educational services for County residents (p. 40).

Being a predominantly agricultural municipality, the MDP also contains policies supporting responsible development of agricultural operations.

The above statements reflect the County's commitment to prioritizing access to quality education for residents, as well as sustainable agricultural practices.

The Intermunicipal Development Plan (IDP) between the County and the Village of Hines Creek, which was adopted in 2022, also supports the retention and promotion of agricultural and institutional uses, including schools. However, as the subject parcel is located outside the plan area for the IDP, those policies are not relevant to the current proposal.

The Land Use Bylaw, another important component of the planning framework, regulates the uses of lands and buildings within the MD, with the goal of achieving sustainable and economically beneficial use of land. Among others, the LUB divides all the lands within the County into districts (or zones) and then assign uses, which determine the appropriate or compatible uses of lands within those districts, based such factors as location, land characteristics, soil capability and adjacent land uses. It also sets certain standards for the development and subdivision of lands, including parcel size, parcel density and setbacks for buildings and structures.

Within the Land Use Bylaw, the subject parcel is zoned Hamlet Public Institutional (HP). The purpose of the district is "to regulate the development of land for uses of either a public or private nature providing services to the community" (p. 147). The only permitted use in the district are signs. Institutional building or use, which include school, is among the discretionary uses enabled in the district. Other uses include cemetery, place of worship, recreational facility, public building, community hall and teacherage. Following is the associated use class definition in section 1.5 of the LUB:

"INSTITUTIONAL BUILDING OR USE" means community buildings and/or uses including, but not limited to; a school, a hospital, a correctional centre, an assisted living facility, or a post office.

The proposed keeping or raising of animals on the school site is currently not contemplated within the Land Use Bylaw. Therefore, an amendment to the LUB is necessary to support and regulate the proposed use.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

The proposed amendment to the LUB will include:

- 1. Use Class Definition
- 2. Enabling the Use, and
- 3. Regulating the Use

Use Class Definition

There are a number of options for defining the proposed use to fit the stated purpose or intent. At the same time, however, it is important to ensure that the proposed use class definition is both clear and specific or limited in such way that it cannot be construed to allow uses or activities that are not contemplated by the proposed amendment. Following is the use class definition proposed by MMSA:

Institutional Farm: means the planting, growing, keeping or raising of plants, crops and/or animals sorely for educational or research purposes by an institution as defined in this Bylaw. An Institutional Farm may either be located on the same site as the host institution as a secondary use, or on a sperate parcel of land as the principal use.

The proposed definition above will allow for both keeping of livestock and planting of crops/plants (which is another future possibility), and is limited to institutional uses and exclusively for educational or research purposes, but not for income-generating purposes. The definition is also intended to accommodate two potential scenarios: the first is where the farm is located on the same site as the host institution, as is the case of the current proposal; the other is where the farm is proposed to be located on a different site from that of the institution, which could be another likely future scenario.

Enabling the Use

In addition to the defining the use, the proposed use would have to be enabled in the appropriate land use district(s) as well as the proper category of use. Currently, institutional uses are enabled in 11 land use districts, namely:

- Agricultural District 1 (AG-1)
- Agricultural District 2 (AG-2)
- Country Residential District 1 (CR-1)
- Country Residential District 2 (CR-2)
- Highway Development District (HD)
- Hamlet General District (HG)
- Hamlet Residential District 2 (HR-2)
- Hamlet Residential District 3 (HR-3)
- Hamlet Commercial District (HC)
- Hamlet Industrial District (HM)
- Hamlet Public/Institutional District (HP)

MMSA recommends that institutional farm be enabled within the following non-residential and non-recreational land use districts:

- Agricultural District 1 (AG-1)
- Agricultural District 2 (AG-2)
- Highway Development District (HD)
- Hamlet General District (HG)
- Hamlet Industrial District (HM)
- Hamlet Public/Institutional District (HP)

This will only limit them to non-residential and non-recreational land use districts. It will also ensure consistency with the intent of other parts of the Bylaw, especially considering the fact that keeping of livestock is currently prohibited in hamlet residential districts. Furthermore, enabling institutional farms as discretionary uses within the above-mentioned districts will provide the Development Authority with the discretion to review and decide on each application on a case-by-case basis, taking into account such factors as the suitability of the location and impact on adjacent land uses in their decision-making process. By contrast, enabling them as a permitted use will eliminate the element of discretion, entitling future applicants to a development permit once all other applicable components of the Land Use Bylaw are complied with.

Based on the foregoing, if there are existing or future institutional uses in other (residential) districts that currently support institutional uses, that want to add institutional farm, then a land use bylaw amendment to redistrict the parcel to a district that supports the use would be required. This will also provide the public with an opportunity to comment or have a say on the proposed amendment prior to a decision by Council.

Regulating the Use

Regulating the use constitutes the final part of the proposed amendment. This will ensure that the development occurs in way that is appropriate or acceptable to the County.

Institutional Farms

- 1. A development permit is required for institutional farms, unless it is part of a comprehensive institutional development application for which a development permit has been issued by the Development Authority.
- 2. Institutional farms may be approved as a temporary or permanent development.
- 3. The Development Authority may limit the number of animals kept or raised on the site.
- 4. Any areas intended for the roaming of animals shall be adequately fenced to the satisfaction of the Development Authority;
- 5. All structures or buildings shall comply with the applicable setbacks for the subject land use district.

- 6. No slaughtering of animals shall be allowed onsite.
- 7. There shall be no retail sale of any produce or products from the farm onsite.
- 8. The development shall not become unsightly.
- 9. All required permits and approvals shall be obtained from the appropriate authorities.

While the LUB amendment request came from the Worsley School, the proposed changes, if approved by Council, would benefit other schools in the County, including the one at Cleardale, which, according to the Chief Administrative Officer, may contemplating having a similar use onsite.

OPTIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

Based on the issues highlighted above, following are the options Council might consider:

Option 1: Review and approve in principle the proposed amendment to the Land Use Bylaw to enable and regulate institutional farms within the County, and incorporate the changes as part the LUB Rewrite.

Option 2: Review and approve in principle the proposed amendment to the Land Use Bylaw to enable and regulate institutional farms within the County, as a standalone amendment to the current Land Use Bylaw, including a holding a public hearing, and later incorporating the changes into the LUB, if adopted.

Option 1 will allow the County to present the proposal as part of comprehensive changes to the Land Use Bylaw, which could be presented to the community at a future Open House prior to formal reading and public hearing of the new LUB, if the timeline also works for the applicant. This may save time and money. Option 2, on the other hand will, allow the public to deal with only the proposed amendment regarding institutional farm. If Council deems the current amendment proposal as potentially controversial or time-sensitive, then option 2 is recommended. If option 2 is chosen, MMSA will prepare a Land Use Amendment Bylaw for Council to provide 1st reading and follow the statutory bylaw adoption process.

CONCLUSION

This planning report has been prepared by MMSA at the request of the Chief Administrative Officer. The report discusses a proposed amendment to the Land Use Bylaw, specifically to allow the keeping of animals on school site by one of the public schools in the County for educational or instructional purposes. In determining the feasibility of the proposal, MMSA has reviewed the proposal, site characteristics, and the County's planning framework, and recommended a proposed amendment to the Land Use Bylaw to facilitate the development. Details of the proposed amendment include a proposed use class definition, enabling the use as a discretionary use within selected land use districts and proposing special regulations to regulate the use. Options for adopting the proposed amendment have also been presented in this report for consideration by Council. Council can recommend additional changes to the proposed amendment as deemed appropriate and determine the path forward.



To the Clear Hills County of Alberta:

We, the undersigned, are concerned citizens of Cleardale and Worsley who request the paving of Range Road 91 through to Township Road 860. This gravel road is heavily used by local residents and the surrounding community as it connects the communities of Cleardale and Worsley. Due to heavy traffic volume it has become a safety concern.

In recent years, the population living along this route has greatly increased. Currently, there are 25 residences along Range Road 860 alone, including one six semi-truck owners, of which some own more than one truck. The increased traffic volume has led to safety concerns about potholes, dust, and visibility. Some residents try calcium dust control; however, rainwater does not absorb well on the calcium-infused dirt and the heavy traffic soon results in large potholes, causing the condition of the road to worsen even more.

Because this route is a popular connector road between Cleardale and Worlsey, traffic often travels at high speeds. Residents report that they don't feel safe to be out walking as traffic doesn't always slow down for pedestrians and that they get sprayed with gravel. This road often gets treated as a main road between our communities but it is not in the condition to be one.

By signing this petition, we request that the councillors of Clear Hills County consider and budget for the paving of Range Road 91 through to Township Road 860 and to prioritise the completion of it in the near future.

Title: ROAD CONSTRUCTION

1. POLICY STATEMENT

- 1.1 Clear Hills County will develop and enhance the vital road network system within the County for the safe transportation of passengers, tourists, industry and goods.
- 1.2 The County will evaluate and prioritize road construction.
- 1.3 All Road Construction Requests will require a completed road request application form to be filled out and submitted to the Clear Hills County office by March 1st to be considered for construction in the following year.
- 1.4 Prior to the approval of new or existing requests, the County will proceed with the required assessment standards set out by Alberta Environments within the MSSC.
 - Definition The Master Schedule of Standards and Conditions (MSSC) identifies conditions that apply to formal disposition applications approved under the Public Land Act. Conditions in this document are part of multiple approval systems and processes.
- 1.5 Following the assessment, a full report will be brought back to Council to present compensation costs and requirements that will need to be met as per Alberta Environment standards prior to proceeding with construction.

1.6 MSSC Assessment Study

Options:

- 1- The County will cover fifty percent (50%) of the costs associated with the initial mandatory MSSC Assessments studies that will determine the compensation and requirements as per Alberta Environment standards. The applicant is required to pay the additional fifty percent (50%) of the costs.
- 2- The County will cover all costs associated with the initial mandatory MSSC Assessments studies that will determine the compensation and requirements as per Alberta Environment standards.

1.7 Study Outcome Compensation

The County will pay up to a maximum of \$10,000.00 (ten thousand dollars) of the Compensation Costs, per road construction application. All compensation costs will be required to be paid in full by the applicant prior to the commencement of construction.

1.8 Construction

The County will pay up to a maximum of \$200,000.00 (two hundred thousand dollars), per $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, for the engineering and construction cost on approved road construction applications.





SPECIAL PROVISIONS

4. SPECIAL PROVISIONS

4.1 SCOPE OF WORK AND SPECIFICATIONS

All reference to "Specifications" in this Request for Quotation document will be understood to mean "Government of Alberta-Transportation: Standard Specifications for Highway Construction – Edition 15, 2013."

The specifications for highway and bridge construction work, which shall form part of the Contract Agreement, are published in the following Government of Alberta – Transportation manuals:

- Standard Specifications for Highway Construction Edition 15, 2013
- Specifications for Bridge Construction Edition 15, 2013
- General Specification, Specification Amendments and Supplemental Specifications for Highway and Bridge Construction, Edition 15, 2013

In the Hamlet of Cleardale, a 145m x 107m truck parking lot shall be constructed at the locations and dimensions shown on the drawings and/or as directed by the Consultant. The Contractor shall strip the required area of topsoil; perform grading work to prepare the subgrade to meet a minimum of 100% compaction prior to placing gravel surfacing. The finished surface shall ensure the positive drainage of water from the site. Preparation of the area will be paid for under the unit price bid for "Common Excavation" and will be inclusive of topsoil removal, grading and shaping, compaction and all other work and materials necessary to complete the work to the satisfaction of the Consultant.

In areas, the finished truck parking lot may be slightly higher than the existing terrain. In these areas the Contractor shall landscape the area with gradual even slopes.

The Scope of Work includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Common excavation

- · Other work as indicated in the unit price schedule and special provisions

Unless otherwise specified, the Contractor shall supply all materials necessary to complete the Work. 4.2 SUPPLY OF AGGREGATE (CONTRACTOR SUPPLY WITH NO OPTION)

The Contractor shall supply aggregates entirely from sources of his own choice. Supply of aggregate will not be paid for separately. The cost of supplying aggregate is considered incidental to the work, or included in the unit price bid for the work for which the aggregate is being produced.

4.3 CONSTRUCTION STAKING

The Contractor is responsible for field engineering survey services to control the installation of the Work, using the horizontal and vertical survey control reference points established or set by the Consultant. The Contractor is to determine that all survey information is correct prior to starting construction.

The Consultant will set a reference point hub line, for elevations and lines, with hubs at intervals which the Consultant deems suitable for the performance of the Work. Only one set of reference points will be established for the Work.

The Contractor shall give forty-eight (48) hours notice of the need for reference points. The Contractor shall discontinue Work and advise the Consultant immediately if an error is suspected in drawings, specifications, reference points, string lines, grade sheets or any other aspect of the work. To proceed with the Work where an error in survey is suspected constitutes full acceptance for costs associated with correction of the Work.

The Consultant will provide:

- One set of survey control reference points and work stakes
- · Culvert installation locations and elevations
- One set of final grade stakes

Any further or additional staking shall be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall be required to provide a survey aid occasionally to assist the Project Manager in any measurements or survey requirements during construction.

4.4 COMMON EXCAVATION

4.4.1 Definition

For the purpose of this Contract all excavation and placement of material from within the right-of-way, shall be defined as "Common Excavation".

Should construction work-stake limits extend outside the right-of-way to include design backslopes or adjacent access road construction and roadway obliterations, the excavation, placement and/or disposal of the materials from within these expanded limits shall also be classified as "Common Excavation."

Unusable common material will require removal off-site. Any unusable common excavation material which exceeds the fill requirements or is deemed as unsuitable for re-use on-site in the graded areas shall be removed off-site. The Contractor shall assume ownership of all unusable excavated material and dispose of the material in a manner acceptable to the Consultant. Disposal off-site shall be considered incidental to "Common Excavation" and no separate or additional payment will be made.

Surplus topsoil may be stockpiled on site as directed by the consultant or the County Representative. A designated area for stockpiling of surplus material may be arranged through the County at the time of construction.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

4.4.2 Measurement and Payment

For the purpose of this Contract all excavation and placement of common excavation (including topsoil stripping, initial handling of topsoil, design undercut, design ditch excavation, waste material and channel excavation) will be paid for at the stipulated lump sum price bid for "Common Excavation" and will be based on the design quantities. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to ensure acceptance of the estimated design quantities provided by the Consultant prior to bidding on this project.

Should additional payment be required for Common Excavation due to design alterations or excavation to remove unsuitable material, payment to the Contractor will be made by taking the Lump Sum bid price and dividing it by the quantity of design Common Excavation to obtain a per cubic metre unit price.

The Contractor shall be responsible for procuring the borrow site, acquiring of reclamation certificates, and all site restoration. All work involving the removal or replacement of borrow material, haul road construction, fencing, clearing and timber salvage and site reclamation will be considered incidental to the unit price bid for "Borrow Excavation – Contractor Supplied".

The Contractor shall be responsible to arrange for and ensure that the borrow material and locations are satisfactory to his requirements.

All terms and payments under the agreements established by the Contractor and any affected landowner shall remain the responsibility of the Contractor.

The Contractor shall ensure that a Conservation and Reclamation Approval from Alberta Environmental Protection and clearance from the Archaeological Survey of Alberta are in place prior to the removal of any borrow material from the Contractor's source.

The Contractor is advised that it may take up to six weeks to obtain the above approvals and clearances.

Environmental regulations for borrow material must be adhered to and the Contractor shall ensure that this work is in compliance with Local Road Authority guidelines.

All dugout borrow adjacent to the local roads shall be set at a minimum of 40 metres from the local road right-of-way boundary. If required, the Contractor must also obtain approval from the local authorities prior to constructing a dugout. The Contractor shall also obtain clearance from environmental authorities.

No additional payment will be made for the supplying of borrow material, excavating, loading, hauling, placing, spreading, trimming, fencing, topsoil removal or replacement, constructing access roads, pit sealing, reseeding of the borrow, or obtaining environmental approvals or studies but will all be considered incidental to the unit prices bid for "Borrow Excavation – Contractor Supplied".

4.6 OVERHAUL

There will be no separate bid item for overhaul on this project. No separate payment will be made for relocating topsoil or common excavation material to different locations but will be incidental to the bid item "Common Excavation".

4.7 ROCK EXCAVATION

There will be no classification of or separate payment for "Solid Rock Excavation". References to classification and payment for solid rock excavation in Specification 2.3 are deleted. Approved excavation of material which otherwise would have met the classification for solid rock will be classified and paid for as "Common Excavation" as applicable,

4.8 GRAVEL SURFACING (SUPPLY AND PLACE)

Upon completion of the grading work, the compacted roadway shall be graveled. Gravel shall be applied in two separate lifts of 75 mm each.

4.8.1 Application and Compaction

The first lift (Des. 4 Class 40) shall be applied upon completion of a section of roadway, and the second lift (Des. 4 Class 25) shall be applied once the first lift has been compacted onto the subgrade surface at a design depth of 75mm per lift.

The initial lift of surfacing gravel shall be compacted onto the subgrade surface. The gravel shall be windrowed and spread uniformly across the subgrade surface. Water shall be applied to the surface until acceptable moisture content is attained, as directed by the Consultant. The gravel shall then be compacted by means of a vibratory smooth drum compactor, to the satisfaction of the Consultant. The Final lift of surfacing gravel will be applied utilizing the same procedure as the initial lift.

The surfacing gravel material is required to be fully watered and compacted in conjunction with the placement of the material on the roadway surface. Failure to complete this process may result in non payment for material hauled and insufficiently spread, watered, and compacted. The Contractor may be required to re-apply surface gravel to these sections at the appropriate application rate at no cost to the Owner.

The final lift of granular material shall be compacted to an average of 98.0% of the maximum dry density established by the moisture-density relation test using standard compaction.

4.8.2 Payment

Payment for the supplying, processing, loading, hauling, placing, spreading, watering and compacting of the surface gravel on the project will be made at the stipulated lump sum price bid for "Gravel Surfacing" and will be based on the design quantities. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to ensure acceptance of the estimated design quantities provided by the Consultant prior to bidding on this project.

4.9 TOPSOIL DISTRIBUTION

4.9.1 General

All topsoil in disturbed areas within the right-of-way, shall be salvaged for reuse. Any required stockpiling of the topsoil material shall be performed so as to minimize topsoil losses and

contamination of the topsoil and surrounding materials, using methods and locations approved by the Consultant.

Upon completion of the roadway work, the Contractor shall evenly redistribute the salvaged topsoil along the sideslopes, backslopes and ditch bottoms or to the limits identified by the Consultant.

4.9.2 Measurement and Payment

Measurement of the "Topsoil Distribution" shall be made based upon the square metre area of disturbed right-of-way, which has been re-topsoiled to a depth of no less than 70 mm of material. The area measured for payment shall be based on horizontal measurements with no allowances made for uneven or sloping ground.

This **second movement and placement of topsoil material** shall be paid for at the unit price bid per square metre for "**Topsoil Distribution**."

No additional payment will be made for the excavating, loading, hauling (including overhaul), placing, spreading and trimming of the topsoil material, which shall be considered incidental to the unit price bid for "Topsoil Distribution".

4.10 CULVERTS

4.10.1 General

The Contractor shall supply and install all new galvanized corrugated steel pipe (CSP) of the sizes and lengths shown on the drawings or as directed by the Consultant. Sloped end sections (4:1) are required for each culvert. The culverts are to be installed as per the plans and specifications or as directed by the Consultant.

Payment for CSP culverts supplied and installed by the Contractor will be made at the unit price bid for "Culverts - Supply and Install" for the applicable size of culvert. This payment will be compensation in full for supplying and hauling the culvert material, installing the pipe, including all appurtenances as required, channel excavation, preparation of the bed, back-filling, compacting, and the use of all equipment, tools, labour and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

4.10.2 Hand Laid Riprap

All culverts supplied and installed by the Contractor shall be rip rapped as per Drawing CB6-2.5M1 and shall be considered part of the unit price bid for "Culverts – Supply and Install". No additional payment shall be made for the supplying and hauling of the riprap material, preparation of the placement area, placement of the riprap and/or the use of all equipment, tools, labour and incidentals necessary to complete the work.

4.10.3 Channel Excavation for Roadway Culverts

There will be no separate payment for Channel Excavation under this contract. The cost incurred for Channel Excavation will be incidental to the unit prices bid for "Culverts - Supply and Install".

4.11 BROADCAST SEEDING

All species of grass/grain shall meet the requirements of the Canada Seed Act for Certified Seed Canada #1. The seed shall be tested by a recognized seed house with an attached weed seed analysis certificate, which is free of Noxious Weeds as indicated by the Weed Control Act of Alberta, or by law.

In addition to the above specifications, the seed shall have <u>0 (zero) tolerance to Sweet Clover.</u> The recommended basic mixture for Clear Hills County shall be:

(60%) Fall Rye (16%) Creeping Red Fescue (12%) Brome (05%) Timothy (07%) Alsike Clover (100%) Total

Grass seed mix shall be applied at a minimum rate of 30 kg/ha. The grade of fertilizer used on the project shall be 11-52-0 applied at a minimum rate of 75 kg/ha.

4.11.1 Measurement and Payment

Broad-Cast Seeding will be measured by the square metre based on horizontal measurements as determined by the Consultant. No allowance will be made for uneven or sloping round, overlap.

Payment for "Broad-Cast Seeding" will be made at the unit price bid per square metre. This payment will be considered full compensation for the supply and placement of seed, fertilizer, harrowing, and reseeding as applicable, and includes all labour, materials, equipment, tools and incidentals necessary to complete the Work to the satisfaction of the Consultant.

1,2,54,1,2 Resolution of Claims

Where the Owner (or their Representative) or the Contractor considers that a Claim has arisen under the Contract, the Owner (or their Representative) or the Contractor shall issue a Notice of Claim to the other party.

A Notice of Claim shall be in writing and shall state the details of the claim. A Notice of Claim issued by the Contractor to the Owner pursuant to this Contract shall be served to the Consultant.

A Notice of Claim shall be served as soon as possible after the occurrence of the circumstance giving rise to the Claim and not later than seven (7) days after the occurrence of the circumstance, or the claimant becoming aware of the circumstance. Failure to serve a Notice of Claim within the prescribed time period will preclude the claimant from proceeding with the Claim.

The Parties shall make bona fide efforts to resolve a claim and the Work shall proceed without delay during the claims resolution process. This shall include both parties actively participating in the resolution of the claim, neither of whom may delegate the resolution of the claim to another party. Attempts to resolve claims shall sequentially follow the administrative review structure as follows:

- 1 Consultant Project Manager / Area Manager / Regional Manager
- 2. The Public Works Manager / Ron Jensen / Clear Hills County

If there is failure to reach agreement through this administrative review, either party may proceed to litigation either with or without the agreement of the other party.
