

A fire advisory is in effect for the Peace River Forest Area section of the Forest Protection Area due to drying conditions and high wind.

Under this advisory:

- Existing fire permits are still valid.
- New permits will be issued on a case-by-case basis, only for essential burning.

Prohibited:

• Any burning without a valid fire permit, other than a campfire is prohibited.

Although there is still snow coverage in some areas, there are bare spots throughout the forest area that pose a risk for new wildfire starts. Return to winter burn sites to ensure they are completely extinguished. These fires can smoulder underground and flare up into a wildfire when the conditions are right.





Average Daily and Annual Water Requirements

The average daily and annual water requirement numbers can be used for estimating the amount of water used on a farm. The average daily water requirements are based on typical average outside or in-barn temperatures that occur throughout the year. These numbers, however, cannot be used for designing the water supplies and pumping capacity of a farm water system. For example, consider a beef feedlot on a hot summer day. Feeder cattle will drink approximately twice the amounts shown in the table below. For this reason, the water supply and pumping systems need to be designed to meet these peak demands.







Fun Facts about St. Patrick's Day

St. Patrick is really from Britain - St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland, was born in Britain in the 4th century. While toiling as a shepherd, he escaped back to England, but eventually returned to Ireland as a Christian missionary.

St. Patrick's Day used to be blue--not green - It's said the shift to wearing green for St. Paddy's Day happened because of Ireland's nickname 'The Emerald Isle', the green in the Irish flag and the shamrock. Legend has it that wearing green makes a person invisible to leprechauns that will pinch someone if they see them. In Ireland, some still adhere to the tradition of Catholics wearing green, and Protestants wearing orange--the colours that represent their religious sects on the flag.

So. Much. Beer. - The Irish beer Guinness is a top choice for imbibing on March 17, and folk the world over drink a ton of it. As mentioned, skip the green-coloured stuff. Stick to beer as nature intended, or maybe go for an Irish coffee instead?

Shamrock isn't a sham - According to folklore, St. Patrick used the shamrock, the familiar three-leafed clover and symbol of spring, to explain the Christian Holy Trinity. The word "shamrock" comes from the Irish word "seamróg," meaning "little clover." It is the symbol of Ireland, and wearing and displaying shamrocks has become a widespread practice on St. Patrick's Day.

Irish Cheddar Spring Onion Biscuits

By layering and folding the cheese into the dough, à la puff pastry, we get all the cheesy flavor without making the biscuit too dense.

Ingredients

2 cups self-rising flour, plus more for kneading

1/4 teaspoon baking soda

7 tablespoons very cold butter, cut into pieces

3/4 cup buttermilk, plus additional for brushing

1/2 cup shredded Irish Cheddar cheese, divided, plus more for topping

1/4 cup sliced green onions, divided

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.

Whisk self-rising flour and baking soda together in a mixing bowl. Add cold butter and cut it into flour with a pastry blender until texture resembles coarse crumbs, 5 to 7 minutes. Make a well in the center of the flour mixture and pour in the buttermilk. Stir with a fork just until mixture starts to come together to form a shaggy dough.

Step 3

Transfer dough to a floured work surface. Press into a roughly shaped rectangle. Fold into thirds using a bench scraper. Press again into a rectangle. Flour surface if the dough seems sticky. Roll dough with a rolling pin to 1/2-inch thickness. Sprinkle with half of the shredded cheese and half of the green onions. Fold dough into thirds. Dust with flour, if necessary, and roll out again to about 1/2-inch thickness. Top with remaining cheese and green onions. Fold into thirds and roll out again to about 1/2 inch thickness. Cut biscuits with a 2- or 3-inch biscuit cutter.

Step 4

Transfer biscuits to prepared baking sheet. Brush lightly with buttermilk. Sprinkle tops with about a teaspoon of grated cheese.

Step 5

Bake in preheated oven until cooked through and golden brown, about 20 minutes. Transfer to a rack to cool.

Chef's Notes:

To make your own self-rising flour for this recipe, sift together 2 cups all-purpose flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, and 1 teaspoon fine salt.

If you can't find Irish Cheddar, like Dubliners(R), use your favorite sharp Cheddar cheese instead.

Baking time is reduced slightly in the magazine version of this recipe.
